

Maths and Numeracy	Create your own set of maths problems that a hero must solve to complete a mission (e.g. rescue someone, unlock a code, stop a villain)	Imagine you're setting up a superhero headquarters. What would you buy? Create a simple shopping list with prices and add up the total. Try setting a budget and work out what you can afford.
Languages, Literacy and Communication	Invent your own hero! Give them a name, powers, a weakness and a mission. Write a character profile including a short back history - how did they become a hero?	Write a diary entry as if you are a hero who had a big adventure today. What happened? How did you feel? Did you save someone or solve a problem?
Science and Technology	Design or make a gadget that your hero could use. What does it do? How does it work? You can draw and label it or build it using things from around the house.	Record a pretend interview with a hero (you can act as both the hero and the reporter). Edit the video to add titles, music or effects.
Expressive Arts	Use your imagination to design a colourful hero cape or shield that shows what kind of hero you are. Think about colours, symbols and patterns that show strength, kindness or courage.	Make up a short song, chant or rap about your hero or what it means to be a hero. Use pots, pans or other objects to make a rhythm and perform it to your family.
Humanities	Research a famous person from the past who helped others or stood up for what was right (e.g. Florence Nightingale, Nelson Mandela, etc)	Make a map showing the different places around the world where heroes have made a difference. Choose 3 countries and find out about a hero from each one. Mark them on your map and add a short note about what they do.
Health and Wellbeing	Create your own superhero workout routine! Think about what exercises heroes might do to stay strong and healthy. E.g. power jumps, rope climbs, fast sprints	Complete 5 acts of kindness at home. Write them down or draw them. E.g. helping someone without being asked, saying something kind, sharing your toys. Kindness is a true hero power!
