Languages, Literacy and Communication	<p>Write a short paragraph in Welsh introducing yourself (e.g., "Fy enw i ydy... Dw i'n hoffi..."). Use vocabulary we've learned in class.</p>	<p>Write or retell a Welsh myth or legend (e.g., The Giant of Snowdon or The Lady of the Lake). Add illustrations if you wish!</p>
Science and Technology	<p>Make a fact sheet about a Welsh animal (e.g., red kite, badger, puffin). Include where it lives, what it eats, and an illustration.</p>	<p>Use a digital tool (e.g., PowerPoint, Canva, iMovie) to make a short presentation about your favourite place in Wales.</p>
Expressive Arts	<p>Design a Welsh flag with symbols that represent <i>you</i> and your identity. Write a short description of what each part means.</p>	<p>Learn and perform a Welsh song or dance (e.g. <i>Calon Lân, Dawnsio Gwerin</i>). Record or perform it for the class.</p>
Humanities	<p>Research a famous Welsh person (e.g. Roald Dahl, Gareth Bale, Betsi Cadwaladr). Create a fact file or mini biography.</p>	<p>Draw a map of Wales and label cities, rivers, mountains, and a place that is special to you or your family</p>
Health and Wellbeing	<p>Create a healthy Welsh menu for a day. Include breakfast, lunch, and dinner using traditional or local ingredients.</p>	<p>Make a 'My Welsh Identity' poster with pictures and words showing what makes you feel Welsh or proud of Wales</p>
